# GRACE NOTES "Listen Generously"

### THE FPCM WAY OF THE WEEK (January 27-February 3)

**#3: LISTEN GENEROUSLY.** Be quick to listen and do so with your undivided attention. Minimize the distractions and let go of the need to agree or disagree. Suspend your judgment and be curious to know more rather than jumping to conclusions. Above all, listen to *understand*.

Understand this, my dear brothers and sisters: You must all be quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to get angry. Human anger does not produce the righteousness God desires. (James 1: 19, 20)

I'm asking you to give a gift to those who matter most to you: your children, your parents, your spouse, your grandchildren, your friends, your teammates, your co-workers, and members of your church family. This is a gift that will heal; both individuals and relationships. It's a gift that will demonstrate how much you care like few others you could give. The good news is that this gift is free but don't assume that you can give this gift without some personal cost.

Giving this gift requires time, often a fair amount of it. You'll need to be free of all distractions to give it correctly. This means the TV is turned off, the laptop is closed, the newspaper or magazine is set aside. You can't sit and scroll through social media while giving this gift. You have to be alert, un-distracted in order to give this gift well. You should be looking directly at the receiver. You may be a little tired after this gift has been given. It will take something out of you if you're giving it in the right way.



Studies have been conducted on the best ways to give this gift.

Researchers have discovered that the best givers of this gift do so by asking questions that help the receiver to turn on lights of discovery and insight. When you give this gift the receiver should feel that you care fully for them. They'll feel a little more confident and secure. The best givers of this gift clearly convey that they are present to help and not win an argument.

The receiver will likely walk away from the reception of this gift feeling the warmth of your love and strength of your support. So powerful is this gift and it is given so infrequently that those who receive it often have no words to express their appreciation. It doesn't matter if they can't find the words to thank you. Giving it is what matters.

The gift is listening. Listen generously.
