- 4. If we take Jesus' command to heart, what might be the cost of being known by love?
- 5. Here is the harder question. If you're being honest with yourself, what cost are you unwilling to pay to love one another?
- 6. If we are known by love, how is God glorified? Does glorifying excite you?

OUTRO: Christian denominations have become adept at enumerating their beliefs so that they can be differentiated from one another. Everything else, though, is secondary to our love revealing the love of Christ. They will know us by our love, but it is also by our love that they will know Him. By our love, we bring the Father glory. By our love, we reveal the nature of Jesus. By our love, we show the power of the Spirit. Be known first by love and let the rest sort itself out in time and relationship.
