What are the Ways?

From reflecting on Scripture and on lives lived with God, FPCM's Staff and Session have distilled 25 Ways that God calls us to live our our faith in community and in devotion to Him.

These Ways are meant to help us create an "atmosphere thick with love," and a culture where God's character is evident in all we do. In short, they show who we aim to be.

How do I Devote?

1. Pick your Best Time and Space

Give God your best time, not your leftovers. Look for a time in your day when you are alert and uninterrupted. It can be helpful to find a location which feels prayerful to you.

2. Be Attentive to Yourself

Before you Devote, be attentive to your own heart and mind. Are you feeling preoccupied... disappointed... resentful? Your personal state will impact your prayer life. Make it known to God.

3. Be Attentive to God

This is your time with God. It is personal and relational. Jesus is listening and the Spirit is present with you. Be with God in this time. Even in silence you can know and enjoy His presence.

4. Read. Think. Pray.

Devoting yourself to God is simple. **Read** scripture, **Think** about what it means and means to you, and **Pray** about it. This can be a time to engage your heart and mind toward God's calling. Don't rush it.

Savor your time in the word and in prayer with God.

5. Live it Out

Now do something about it.

Rest and Reflect

Each Sunday is an opportunity to Rest with God and Reflect on His presence and power in the previous week and how you will respond in the next.

Sabbath can be a powerful force in your life. Take a break and recline into God's grace. Let work take a back seat to joy and peace. Remember all that God has done for you this week. *God* is in control.

Monday

READ: Luke 11:1-13

THINK: Owning our Church starts with the presence of the Spirit in your own life. It is the job of the Spirit to gift and empower us for the work at hand. When you ask, God will grant you His Holy Spirit. Don't skip this step and just try to work harder. Ask for His Spirit.

If you have never asked, **PRAY** that God would gift you with the presence of His Holy Spirit.
Once you have, **PRAY** for the Spirit to show you how you are needed here at FPC.

Tuesday

READ: 1 Peter 2:4-10

THINK: You are a priest. That doesn't mean you wear a little white collar. It means that you are a mediator between people and God. All Christians are priests and called to show who God is and connect others to His love and grace. Own Our Church and live out your priesthood. Be the person at your work, gym, grocery checkout line, or pickup soccer team who connects people to God.




Wednesday

READ: Colossians 1:3-8

THINK: From far away, Paul heard that the Colossians were people of faith, love, and hope. Those words should be the first words that come to mind when others think of Christians. When people know you are a Christian, they will judge our faith by your life. Let them see faith, love, and hope. Own Our Church in all you do by letting people see our faith, love, and hope in Christ.

PRAY: that Jesus would give you more faith, love, and hope.



Thursday

READ: Romans 16:1-16

THINK: Women didn't normally have leadership roles in the 1st century, but they did in the church. Phoebe was deacon and a benefactor. Don't let anyone tell you that something about you keeps you from being able to serve. Especially if you feel like the world doesn't respect you, we need you to Own Our Church and be an example of what the Kingdom of God is like.

PRAY: that all types of people feel respected and empowered at our Church.




Friday

READ: Numbers 9:15-23

THINK: Sometimes it feels like other people have a special relationship with God, special gifts, or a special call. Simply put: sometimes it feels like you are an Israelite in a book about Moses. Don't compare your faith to what you think someone else's faith is like. When it feels like your playing a small role in a larger plan, Own Our Church anyway. Don't let false comparisons keep you from serving however you can.

PRAY: God would show you how large the harvest is in Moorestown.



Saturday

READ: 1 Kings 6:11-14

THINK: While it is true that the Church is not the building but the people, the building still matters. It is in our building that thousands of people have met and worshipped God. We make it holy ground because as the church gathers, God is there. We make it God's house because it is there that His family gets together. Own Our Church building as holy ground and celebrate the lives which have been changed there.

PRAY: God would continue to use our building as a place where He changes lives.
