Way of the Week 8 (Aug. 9-16)

8. JUMP IN. Life is full of unexpected problems and needs, large and small. Pay attention to moments when God calls you to action, no matter how ordinary or extraordinary the situation may be. See “disruptions” as invitations to share Christ’s love. Write a note. Visit the sick or the grieving. Share a meal.




- ⇒ *O people, the LORD has told you what is good, and this is what he requires of you: to do what is right, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God. (Micah 6:8)*
- ⇒ *What good is it, dear brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but don’t show it by your actions? Can that kind of faith save anyone? Suppose you see a brother or sister who has no food or clothing, and you say, “Good-bye and have a good day; stay warm and eat well” – but then you don’t give that person any food or clothing. What good does that do? So you see, faith by itself isn’t enough. Unless it produces good deeds, it is dead and useless. (James 2: 14–17)*
- ⇒ *Dear children, let’s not merely say that we love each other; let us show the truth by our actions. Our actions will show that we belong to the truth, so we will be confident when we stand before God. (1 John 3: 18)*

Ideas for Action: Practice one of the actions listed in this week’s description: Write a note, visit someone who lives alone, and/or share a meal.

Way of the Week 9 (Aug. 16-23)

9. PRAY FIRST AND PRAY AGAIN. Ask *first* for God’s guidance and blessing in everything you do. Through prayer, ask for wisdom and for God’s will to be done. Pray for others as well, that God’s love and blessing would be revealed to them in good times and in bad.



- ⇒ *Trust in the Lord with all your heart; do not depend on your own understanding. Seek his will in all you do, and he will show you which path to take. (Proverbs 3: 5, 6)*
- ⇒ *May your Kingdom come soon. May your will be done on earth, as it is in heaven.” (Matt. 6: 10)*
- ⇒ *Pray in the Spirit at all times and on every occasion. Stay alert and be persistent in your prayers for all believers everywhere. (Ephesians 6: 18)*

Ideas for Action: On your next walk, run, or in your quiet time, intentionally pray for neighbors, other churches, schools, EMTs, police and fire personnel, and local officials. If you’re stalled in your prayer life, reach out to one of the pastors or a member of the Prayer Team for a suggestion.

Session recently approved a recommendation for an 8:30 a.m. Sunday outdoor worship service to be held in the courtyard between the Commons Lobby and Sanctuary, near the Blessing Box. The service will be 30-35 minutes with an abbreviated Order of Worship.

This is an outside event and weather dependent. Worshipers will stand, bring their own lawn chairs and/or sit in a parked car. There will be no access to church buildings or restrooms. Masks are required on church grounds and physical distancing will be strictly observed. We'll likely maintain this schedule through October, taking advantage of beautiful weather.
