## Moorestown Prayer Vigil Planned for June 20, 2020

- When and Where: Saturday, June 20, 2020 (10:00 a.m.) ~ Location: Memorial Field, 254 S. Church Street, Moorestown, NJ 08057
- <u>Purpose:</u> For the churches of Moorestown to gather together to seek God and pray for God's healing, justice, mercy and reconciliation to be known widely within our lives, homes, churches, town, community and nation.
- Prayer Walk (optional) 9:00 a.m. ~ Saturday, June 20<sup>th</sup>. We will first gather at our Prayer Labyrinth, by the entrance to the cemetery. Those who want to will then quietly walk through town while praying. This is not a march. We ask that walkers use the sidewalks and obey all pedestrian laws. Physical distancing and the wearing of masks is expected. Following the sad news of the counter protestors in Franklin Township earlier this week, Police Chief Lieber asks that prayer walkers not carry signs. His concern is for the safety of those who will attend. Our Prayer Walk will be guided by our Prayer Team. Due to safety concerns, this Prayer Walk portion of the event is NOT to be published outside of our membership, i.e. no social media.
- The Prayer Vigil should last around 40 minutes. There is parking at Memorial Field. Participants are asked to wear masks and practice physical distancing. There are no public bathrooms available.
