"Day 6: A Wonderful World and You Belong In It"

Scripture Text: Genesis 1: 24-31 (NLT)

Then God said, "Let the earth produce every sort of animal, each producing offspring of the same kind—livestock, small animals that scurry along the ground, and wild animals." And that is what happened. ²⁵ God made all sorts of wild animals, livestock, and small animals, each able to produce offspring of the same kind. And God saw that it was good. ²⁶ Then God said, "Let us make human beings^[a] in our image, to be like us. They will reign over the fish in the sea, the birds in the sky, the livestock, all the wild animals on the earth, ^[b] and the small animals that scurry along the ground." ²⁷ So God created human beings^[c] in his own image.
