13. OPEN DOORS FOR OTHERS TO LEAD. Encourage others to step into leadership by sharing responsibilities and mentoring. Let go of the jobs you've always done and allow new leaders to emerge. Remember that our youth and young adults are not solely the future of our church but are vitally important for our *present*.

Lent-In-a-Bag Take Home Activity: Praying with Jesus

The 40 days of Lent has historically been a time of fasting, prayer, and study for those wishing to grow closer to God. It can be a time for personal and collective reflection and transformation. We look honestly at ourselves and are reminded of who we belong to while aligning with Christ's sacrifice. In scripture, the number 40 is significant as the Israelites spent forty years in the wilderness preparing for the promised land, and Jesus went into the wilderness for forty days to prepare for his ministry. These two stories show us that God can use Lent to help us make new choices and begin a new direction for our hearts and lives. The Lent bags will also include the One Great Hour of Sharing "fish banks" for Palm Sunday's offering.

Lent-in-a-Bag is a take-home activity we are offering to each FPC Moorestown family. <u>Read more on our online events</u> <u>page, eblast, or website</u>. The First Sunday in Lent was February 21. Bags were available starting on Ash Wednesday.

- ⇒ What it Contains: Each kit contains everything you need. Families will pick one day each week, and after dinner or before bedtime, take turns, reaching in and pulling out the self-contained devotion for the week. This Lent-in-a-Bag is themed "Praying with Jesus." Each Scripture and devotion are about one of the times Jesus used prayer before a major act or immediately after. This does not require much time, but families, especially children, will look forward to each week with anticipation.
- ⇒ How to receive one: If you would like to pick up a Lent-in-a-Bag, they are available in the Commons Lobby during Choristers and Crossing Zone, and Sunday Mornings in the Commons Lobby.
