#### The Meaning of Advent

"The celebration of Advent is possible only to those who are troubled in soul, who know themselves to be poor and imperfect, and who look forward to something greater to come." ~ Dietrich Bonhoeffer

The word "Advent" is derived from the Latin word *adventus*, meaning "coming," which is a translation of the Greek word *parousia*. Scholars believe that during the 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> centuries in Spain and Gaul, Advent was a season of preparation for the baptism of new Christians at the January feast of Epiphany, the celebration of God's incarnation represented by the visit of the Magi to the baby Jesus, his baptism in the Jordan River by John the Baptist, and his first miracle at Cana. During this season of preparation, Christians would spend 40 days in penance, prayer, and fasting to prepare for this celebration.

Today, the season of Advent lasts for four Sundays leading up to Christmas. At that time, the new Christian year begins with the twelveday celebration of Christmastide, which lasts from Christmas Eve until Epiphany on January 6.

Advent 2021 begins on Sunday, November 28, and ends on Christmas Eve, Friday, December 24. Generally, the themes that correspond to each week of Advent fall into these categories:

Week 1: Hope (purple candle)
Week 2: Love (purple candle)
Week 3: Joy (pink candle)
Week 4: Peace (purple candle)
Christmas Eve: Christ Candle (white candle)

#### **The Chrismon Tree**

One delight of the Advent season is seeing the Chrismon tree in place in the sanctuary. "Chrismon" combines two words - Christ and monogram. The ornaments are white and gold, white being the liturgical color for Christmas, and gold being the symbol for the glory and majesty of God. Chrismon designs are simple copies of symbols from early Christianity. Some familiar ones are the star, the cross, the fish, the Rose of Sharon, the crown and the Dove. The triangle symbolizes the Triune God, and some have significant Greek words.

In 2019 we celebrated the 50<sup>th</sup> year that women of the church have decorated the tree. As we view the tree, we reaffirm the birth of Jesus, our Lord and Savior in its symbols. Thank you Presbyterian Women!
