The Confession of Belhar emerged out of apartheid South Africa in 1986 and was adopted by the Presbyterian Church (USA) as a confession of faith in 2016. Belhar testifies to the unity, reconciliation and justice of Jesus Christ and the church's responsibility in bearing witness to this in the world. It is the hope of Dr. Spencer and Rev.
