The Presbytery of West Jersey had become the Presbytery For Southern NJ (yes, "For" with an "F") and that meant new churches for us to reach out to, new bylaws to be written, and new officers to be chosen and installed.

more than \$1,800.00 will be forwarded to the Thank
Offering committee of PW Churchwide for distribution.

A bit of history of the Thank Offering as printed in the HORIZONS magazine: "Eliza Clokey of Springfield, Ohio, planted the seed for the Thank Offering in 1888 when she urged each woman to give one dollar over and above her usual contribution to the Women's General Missionary Society of the UPC of NA. Since then, faithful givers have responded to Eliza's call. Over the last 33 years, Presbyterian Women has granted nearly \$27 million to more than 1,600 different projects at home and around the world through the PW Thank Offering."

In 2021 the Creative Ministries Offering Committee reviewed 29 Thank Offering applications and selected 12 projects for funding. Nine of these serve people in the United States and three are international. In keeping with the Thank Offering bylaws, more than 40 percent of the selected projects are related to health ministries. ### TRINITY PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN CHERRY HILL

It was the first PW in-person gathering for both Trinity and the Presbytery PW since 2019. 40 women gathered in support of our mission, The Military Support Group of New Jersey. We had a wonderful morning of fellowship with our sisters from PW groups across the Presbytery For Southern New Jersey.

We learned of the vital mission of the support group and how much it means to our military families and our soldiers, sailors and marines deployed around the world from the founder, Karen Jennings. We collected donations of items to send to our deployed soldiers that included snack, personal care items, socks, and puzzle books. We also collected grocery items for their families here in New Jersey.

We voted on our new presbytery PW by-laws and installed our new board members.

Finally, we enjoyed lunch together with box lunches from Honey Baked Ham. What a special treat to share a meal together after so much time. Praise the Lord.



#### FIRST PREBYTERIAN CHURCH IN HADDONFIELD


PW of First Presbyterian Church in Haddonfield is continuing to support **Kiva** as part of our mission giving since April 2016 by using memorial funding we received. The focus has been to improve educational opportunities for women.

More than 1.7 billion people around the world are unbanked and can't access the financial services they need. Kiva is an international nonprofit, founded in 2005 in San Francisco, with a mission to expand financial access to help underserved communities thrive.

By November 1, 2021, we had lent to people living in 19 out of a possible 77 countries/territories including Albania, Cambodia, Columbia, Ecuador, El Salvador, Georgia, Jordan, Kenya, Lebanon, Nicaragua, Pakistan,

Palestine, Paraguay, Peru, Philippines, Samoa, Tajikistan, Uganda, and the United States.,

Since we started this mission, we have loaned money to a total of 63 persons. Thirty-nine (39) have totally repaid their loans and twenty-four (24) are currently paying back. We have loaned money to people for assistance in the following sectors:



Education, Health, Services, Food and Retail, for the following activities: beauty salon, education provider, food production/sales, general store, higher education cost, primary/secondary schooling, cereals, food market, fruits and vegetables, grocery store and medical clinic. The majority of these loans (32) have been made for higher education cost and primary/secondary schooling.

#### FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH OF MOORESTOWN

Greetings from the PW Coordinating Team at First Presbyterian Church of Moorestown.

Our PWCT met on a monthly basis during the pandemic, either with the help of Zoom or in person. We were determined to keep things as normal as possible for the women of our church. Our five Circles continued to meet—sometimes on zoom, both outside and inside our church and in homes. Three Circles participated in the Horizon studies, one Circle did a separate study and the fifth continued their service to our ministries.

We held Fall, Winter, and Spring Gatherings in 2020 and 2021:

- Winter Gathering 2020—Kelly LePenske (FPC Director of Congregational Ministries) presented "Living the Psalms," her spiritual journey, which was followed by our traditional soup lunch.
- Spring Gathering 2020—Mindy Holman (Chairwoman of Holman Enterprises) shared her professional and spiritual story in "Family First: Keeping the Family in the Family Business."

- Fall Gathering 2020—Pam Burgess-Main (International Ambassador to Urban Promise and author) presented a program in conjunction with the Horizon Study "Into the Light...Finding Hope Through Prayers of Lament," entitled "Let It Out!!!"
- Winter Gathering 2021—Linda Jagiela (FPC Director of Outreach) spoke on "The Changing Face of Mission in the World"
- Spring Gathering 2021—Dr. Jenny Legath (Associate Director, Center for the Study of Religion at Princeton University, and author). She presented "Grace and God's 'Will'—Living and Loving in a Special Needs Family".
- Fall Gathering 2021—Ruth Stotsenburg presented a program in conjunction with the Horizon Study "What My Grandmothers Taught Me: Learning from the Women in Matthew's Genealogy".

We have had over 100 years of Rummage Sales, and were sad to cancel the dates in 2020 and 2021, due to covid protocols. In past years, all proceeds were disbursed to our ministries: The Atlantic City Rescue Mission, The Camden Rescue Mission, The Christian Caring Center, Dawn's Place, Good Counsel Home, Providence House, and Seeds of Hope.

We also have supported the sponsorship of a young woman living in the Philippines through Little Children of the World. We were able to help some through our limited budget and within the Circles. We also continued our support of the Pledge, Thank Offering, Birthday Offering, and Least Coin Offering.



Our Knitting Network worked at home individually to create hats, scarves, gloves, ear warmers, baby blankets, baby sweaters, lap blankets, prayer shawls, chemo hats and bereavement sets. Items are given to FPC members as well as those in need at Cooper Hospital, Urban Promise, Good Counsel, Christian Caring Center, and others. The Knitting Network is just now meeting together again on a monthly basis.

The Coordinating Team and Circle Leaders have worked diligently to maintain a connection with the women of our church through the church website, an annual yearbook, and our Facebook page: *Presbyterian Women of Moorestown NJ* (1st Pres Moorestown PCUSA).



#### HADDON HEIGHTS FIRST PRESBYTERIAN - PW in the Fall of 2021.

The Friendship Circle of First Presbyterian Haddon Heights continued to meet at 9:30 the third Tuesdays of September through May on ZOOM during Covid-19-Pandemic. In June 2021 we were able to come together again safely distanced and masked in the Church Parlor and have continued in-person meetings this Fall season 2021.

Our Bible study this year is "An Abiding Hope; Presence of God in Exodus and Deuteronomy" with Circle members taking turns leading the discussion. Mission service is a strong feature of our group with ongoing financial support of PW Pledges, contributions to the PW special offerings including Least Coin, Birthday, and Thank Offerings. Since 2011 we have given 47 micro loans totaling over \$10,000 through KIVA organization to assist women worldwide in their ability to remain in small businesses and to be able to pay for their children's education. It has been extremely rewarding to see those women repaying their loans which reverts to an account in our name so that we can study the list of applicants to find the next person for a loan.



This year we are supporting the Military Support Group of New Jersey led by Karen Jennings. We share in collecting and distributing donations of goods to be sent in monthly care packages to deployed military troops in all branches of service. Additionally, groceries and personal products are delivered to military families at Pomona Air Base and Joint Base McGuire/Ft Dix/Lakehurst.

Closer to home, we collect and deliver food to YOUR FOOD SHELF in Camden, NJ. At Christmas time we provide wrapped gifts for ladies and toys for children at this food shelf. Our Christmas party 2020 was still a fun time via ZOOM with refreshments delivered to everyone along with a few games. On ZOOM we were able to share our Christmas Eve traditions and read a Christmas poem or card that had special meaning. Baptism gifts, hand embroidered by Circle members, are presented to parents at the infant baptism celebrations in our worship services. Our Circle Leader, Mary Jane Lange, has been the creative glue that has kept us together and even growing in numbers as P W in the Presbytery FOR Southern New Jersey.







# PW's Online Churchwide Gathering Event and Business Meeting



### PW Purposefully Pivots: Setting Course in Unsettling Times!

2021 was a season of firsts. One of PW's firsts was holding a virtual triennial Business Meeting. In "ordinary" years, voting representatives from across the nation come together to set course for the new triennium. Because

of Covid-19, PW met virtually, adapting General Assembly's PC-Biz technology to facilitate the triennial business of PW (thus PW-Biz was developed and put to immediate and very good use!). Voting reps had, in the words of Jan Albert, "a few hoops to jump through," to become familiar with the issues before them but also to become comfortable with engaging new technology, which required two screens. That's right! Two screens! (This may be a perfect time to send your voting rep a valentine as she probably spent many hours trying to secure the technology and perhaps even more effort and time in learning and practicing its use.)

PW's Business Meeting was fun, faithful, and rewarding-certainly not what immediately comes to mind when one considers the words "business meeting"! If you didn't have a chance to tune in or wish to watch anew (the Business Meeting is open to all PW observers), go to PW's YouTube channel, youtube.com/presbyterianwomen and view when it suits your schedule. (It's worth noting that PW are tuning in. Since the Business Meeting was held, the number of YouTube views have increased by more than a third!) In addition to hearing from denominational and PW leaders, voting delegates elected PW's 2021–2024 moderator team (Kathy Reeves, moderator and Kathleen Keefer, vice moderator), and unanimously adopted the 2022-2024 budget and 2018-2020 audit. Voting representatives also considered a resolution to replace the word "Kingdom" in the PW Purpose with "Kin-dom", but less than the 2/3 majority required for a change voted in favor (119 yes, 64 no). Updated language regarding people of color and authorizing editorial autonomy in correcting the bylaws were approved.

#### Online Churchwide Gathering Event

When the Gathering Planning team had to pivot from an in-person event over several days to a shortened online event, it was clear that their choice of theme, Rejoice in Hope, based on Romans 12:12-



13, would serve as a powerful reminder of God's care, a beacon of hope, for anxious hearts in anxious times we experienced in 2020 and 2021.

Live-streamed on PW's Facebook page and web site, many tuned in to gather for the inaugural Online Churchwide Gathering event. The live viewing was upwards of 2,715, a number that reflects devices and not souls—many PWs gathered for watch parties so the precise number of viewers is known only to the One who knows the number of hairs on our heads (Matt. 10:30). Since the Online Gathering is available to view on PW's YouTube page, viewings have (at least) doubled since August 5. Every moment of this Gathering was filled with meaning and purpose and hope. Whether you watch as a party of 1 or 51, you'll be restored and recharged in your PW ministry.

#### Give to the Gathering Offering

During the Online Churchwide Gathering Event, Presbyterian women gave generously to the Gathering Offering, benefitting PW's Annual Fund. To date, \$8,424 has been received. Previously known as the Mission Pledge, the Annual Fund makes possible (in whole or in part) every mission and ministry of Presbyterian Women—from communications like this newsletter to the PW/Horizons Bible study, from PW's presence at the Commission on the Status of Women to your Bible study group or regular circle meeting.
