Imposition of Ashes

Dear People of God: The first Christians observed with great devotion the days of our Lord's passion and resurrection. It was also a time when those who, because of notorious sins, had been separated from the Body of the faithful were reconciled by penitence and forgiveness and restored to the fellowship of the Church. Thereby, the whole congregation was put in mind of the message of pardon and absolution set forth in the Gospel of our Savior and of the need which all Christians continually have to renew their repentance and faith.

I invite you, therefore, in the name of the Church, to the observance of a holy Lent by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's Holy Word. And, to make a right beginning of repentance and as a mark of our mortal nature, let us now seek the Lord, our Maker and Redeemer.
