#### The Chrismon Christmas Tree

One delight of the Advent season is seeing the Chrismon tree in place in the sanctuary. "Chrismon" combines two words - Christ and monogram. The ornaments are white and gold, white being the liturgical color for Christmas, and gold being the symbol for the glory and majesty of God. Chrismon designs are simple copies of symbols from early Christianity. Some familiar ones are the star, the cross, the fish, the Rose of Sharon, the crown and the Dove. The triangle symbolizes the Triune God, and some have significant Greek words.

The Presbyterian Women have been decorating our church's Christmas tree for over 50 years, and will decorate the sanctuary tree on **November 27**<sup>th</sup>. As we view the tree, we reaffirm the birth of Jesus, our Lord and Savior in its symbols. Thank you Presbyterian Women.
