

We welcome Pastor Leon Dorleans to our pulpit -- In 1989, Haiti Outreach Ministries Founding Director Leon Dorleans began preaching in Cite Soleil, one of the poorest slums in Port-au-Prince, Haiti, on a narrow street under tarps with raw sewage running in a ditch directly alongside. Despite the destitute conditions, Pastor Leon's congregation grew as people responded to his preaching of the Word and his steadfast belief that God was with them in the face of extreme hardship. Pastor Leon's vision was to address the spiritual, educational, and healthcare needs of the residents of Cite Soleil.
