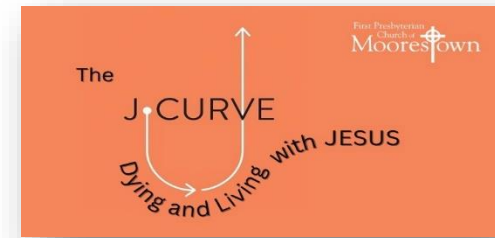
Way of the Week

25. **REJOICE ALWAYS.** The Kingdom of God is a party! Let healthy laughter fill our meetings, our meals, and even our worship. Allow the joy of our faith be clearly evident in our speech and on our faces.

The word rejoice is used in Scripture many times. In fact, it's used in 36 verses! It is first found in the Old Testament in I Chronicles 16:31, "Let the heavens rejoice. Let the earth be glad; let them say among the nations, 'The Lord reigns!'" In the New Testament near the end of Revelation: "Let us rejoice and be glad and give Him glory! (Revelation 19:7). The root of rejoice is joy. The verse I always think of first is Philippians 4:4: "**Rejoice** in the Lord **always**, and again I say, rejoice." Recently, a friend gave me a card which says in large letters ALWAYS REMEMBER JOY - Jesus first; Others second; Yourself last. A quick reminder, isn't it? I rejoice in the Lord God and in His promise of eternal life through His Son, Jesus Christ to all who believe in Him. I believe in Him; and I rejoice in Jesus Christ, my Savior.
